Senate Bill 1226 (S.B. 1226), 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, established an Employment First policy for the state of Texas. The bill establishes employment as the first and preferred option for working-age Texans with disabilities and created an interagency Employment First Task Force. The Texas Department of State Health Services, Mental Health and Substance Abuse Division have implemented initiatives to ensure that Local Mental Health Authorities prioritize employment as an outcome. An Amendment to the Medicaid Plan that would pay for currently non billable supported employment services has also been submitted. As a result of all the initiatives, Texas has seen an increase in the employment rates from 2013 to 2014. This trend has continued in first quarter in FY 2015.
