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CHAPTER 1

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATIONAL MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES SURVEY (N-MHSS)

This report presents findings from the 2015 National Mental Health Services Survey (N-MHSS) conducted from April 2015 through January 2016. The N-MHSS collects information from all known facilities¹ in the United States, both public and private, that provide mental health treatment services to people with mental illness. The Center for Behavioral Health Statistics and Quality (CBHSQ) of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, plans and directs the N-MHSS.

The N-MHSS provides the mechanism for quantifying the dynamic character and composition of the mental health treatment delivery system. It is the only source of national and state-level data on the mental health services delivery system reported by both publicly-operated and privately-operated specialty mental health care facilities. The N-MHSS is designed to collect data on the location, characteristics, and utilization of organized mental health treatment service providers (for facilities within the scope of the survey) throughout the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. territories.² The N-MHSS complements, but does not duplicate, the information collected through SAMHSA's survey of substance abuse treatment facilities, the National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services (N-SSATS).

The objective of the N-MHSS is to collect data that can be used for multiple purposes:

- To assist SAMHSA and state and local governments in assessing the nature and extent of services provided in state-funded, state-operated, and private non-profit and for-profit mental health treatment facilities, and in forecasting mental health treatment resource requirements;
- To update SAMHSA's Inventory of Behavioral Health Services (I-BHS), an inventory of all known mental health and substance abuse treatment facilities in the United States, which can be used as a frame for future surveys of these facilities;
- To describe the nature and scope of some mental health treatment services and conduct comparative analyses for the nation and states; and
- To update the information in the mental health component of SAMHSA's online Behavioral Health Treatment Services Locator, which includes a searchable database of some licensed and accredited public and private facilities for the provision of mental health treatment. The Locator is available at <https://findtreatment.samhsa.gov>.

¹ In this report, entities responding to the N-MHSS are referred to as "facilities." Chapter 1, page 3, *Survey coverage* provides definitions of the types of mental health treatment facilities included in the N-MHSS. Chapter 1, page 5, *Exclusions* provides information on the facilities that were excluded from this report.

Highlights of the Data

- Forty percent of mental health treatment facilities were outpatient mental health facilities [Table 2.2].
- Mental health treatment facilities could offer services in more than one type of service setting (e.g., inpatient, residential, outpatient). Seventy-five percent of all mental health treatment facilities offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services [Table 2.2].
- Most mental health treatment facilities (81 percent) were privately operated—about 63 percent were operated by a private non-profit organization, and the other 18 percent were operated by a private for-profit organization [Table 2.1b].
- Over 95 percent of psychiatric hospitals, general hospitals with a separate psychiatric unit, and Veterans Administration medical centers provided psychotropic medication therapy [Table 2.3b].
- Half of mental health treatment facilities offered exclusively designed treatment programs or groups for persons with serious mental illness (50 percent) and almost half of mental health treatment facilities offered exclusively designed treatment programs for persons with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders (46 percent) [Table 2.6b].
- Almost half of mental health treatment facilities (47 percent) reported that they employ a crisis intervention team to handle acute mental health issues [Table 2.8].
- Most mental health treatment facilities indicated that they accepted Medicaid (88 percent) or cash or self-payment (83 percent) for services [Table 2.9b].

Data Collection Procedures for the 2015 N-MHSS

Field period

The field period for the 2015 N-MHSS, which included mailing and data collection operations, ran from April 30, 2015, through January 19, 2016.

Survey universe

The 2015 N-MHSS survey universe included 17,486 facilities across the United States and its jurisdictions. Most facilities in the 2015 N-MHSS frame were identified from the updated database produced after fielding the 2010, 2012, and 2014 N-MHSS, supplemented by the 2015 mental health augmentation and new facilities that states requested be added to the I-BHS.

Below are the major activities undertaken to make sure SAMHSA has the most complete universe of facilities:

- The updated survey database is comprised of (1) those facilities that were included in the previous survey and are in-scope, and (2) newly identified facilities that became known during the course of the previous survey and are identified as eligible. Facilities that closed or were subsequently found to be out-of-scope are excluded.
- State mental health authorities (SMHAs) are contacted annually and asked to either (1) update and edit their state listing of known facilities or (2) submit a new state listing of known facilities, using an online, password-protected site called the Inventory of Behavioral Health Services (I-BHS) that has been used by the state substance abuse agencies (SSAs) for a number of years.

The information collected through these state listings is processed and cross-checked with the database of facilities in the I-BHS; newly identified facilities are screened for eligibility before being added to the survey database.

- Augmentation includes a number of activities undertaken by our contractor staff. Contact is made on an annual basis to obtain current facility listings from the American Business Index (ABI), the American Hospital Association (AHA), the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), and a number of national behavioral health organizations/associations, such as the National Council for Community Behavioral Healthcare, the National Association of Psychiatric Health Systems, and the American Association of Children’s Residential Centers (AACRC). These listings are cross-checked against the existing I-BHS database and any new facilities are screened (through an augmentation screener questionnaire conducted through phone interview) for eligibility to be included in the database for the upcoming survey. The augmentation screener is also used to screen facilities that were newly identified through the previous survey and through the state listings.

When new eligible facilities are identified between surveys, they are contacted by way of a “between survey update” telephone interview to provide basic facility information. They can then be added to SAMHSA’s online Behavioral Health Treatment Services Locator at <https://findtreatment.samhsa.gov/> instead of waiting an additional year for the next survey.

Survey coverage

The following types of mental health treatment facilities were included in the 2015 N-MHSS:

- *Psychiatric hospitals*—Facilities licensed and operated as state or public psychiatric hospitals or as state-licensed private psychiatric hospitals that primarily provide 24-hour inpatient care to persons with mental illness. They may also provide 24-hour residential care and/or less than 24-hour care (i.e., outpatient, partial hospitalization), but these additional service settings are not requirements.
- *General hospitals with a separate inpatient psychiatric unit*—Licensed general hospitals (public or private) that provide inpatient mental health services in separate psychiatric units. These units must have specifically allocated staff and space for the treatment of persons with mental illness. The units may be located in the hospital itself or in a separate building that is owned by the hospital. Throughout this report (text, figures, and tables), these facilities will be referred to as **general hospitals**.
- *Veterans Administration (VA) medical centers*—Facilities operated by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, including general hospitals with separate psychiatric inpatient units, residential treatment programs, and psychiatric outpatient clinics.
- *Partial hospitalization/day treatment mental health facilities*—Facilities that provide only partial day mental health services to ambulatory clients, typically in sessions of three or more hours on a regular schedule. A psychiatrist generally assumes the medical responsibility for all clients and for the direction of their mental health treatment.
- *Outpatient mental health facilities*—Facilities that provide only outpatient mental health services to ambulatory clients, typically for less than three hours at a single visit. A psychiatrist

generally assumes the medical responsibility for all clients and for the direction of their mental health treatment.

- *Residential treatment centers (RTCs) for children*—Facilities not licensed as psychiatric hospitals that primarily provide individually-planned programs of mental health treatment in a residential care setting for children under age 18. (Some RTCs for children may also treat young adults.) RTCs for children must have a clinical program that is directed by a psychiatrist, psychologist, social worker, or psychiatric nurse who has a master’s or doctoral degree. To qualify as an RTC, the primary reason for admission of more than half of the clients must be mental illness or emotional disturbance that can be classified by DSM-III/DSM-III-R, DSM-IV/DSM-IV-TR, DSM-V, or ICD-9-CM/ICD-10-CM codes, other than codes for intellectual disability, developmental disorders, and substance use disorders.
- *Residential treatment centers (RTCs) for adults*—Facilities not licensed as psychiatric hospitals that primarily provide individually-planned programs of mental health treatment in a residential care setting for adults.
- *Multi-setting mental health facilities³ (non-hospital residential plus outpatient and/or day treatment/partial hospitalization)*—Facilities that provide mental health services in two or more service settings (residential and outpatient and/or day treatment/partial hospitalization) and are not classified as a psychiatric hospital, general hospital, medical center, or residential treatment center.
- *Community mental health center (CMHC)*—Facilities that either (1) provide outpatient services, including specialized outpatient services for children, the elderly, individuals who are chronically mentally ill, and residents of its mental health service area who have been discharged from inpatient treatment at a mental health facility; (2) provide 24-hour emergency care services; (3) provide day treatment or other partial hospitalization services, or psychosocial rehabilitation services; (4) provide screening for patients being considered for admission to state mental health facilities to determine the appropriateness of the admission; and (5) meet applicable licensing or certification requirements for CMHCs in the state in which it is located.
- *Other type of residential treatment facility*—Facilities not licensed as a psychiatric hospital, whose primary purpose is to provide individually-planned programs of mental health treatment services in a residential care setting and is not specifically for children only or adults only.
- *Other* refers to another type of hospital or mental health facility not defined in the categories above.

³ The classification of psychiatric hospital, general hospital, medical center, or residential treatment center—any of which can offer mental health services in two or more service settings—takes precedence over a multi-setting classification.

Exclusions

The 2015 N-MHSS survey universe excluded: (1) Department of Defense (DoD) military treatment facilities; (2) individual private practitioners or small group practices not licensed as a mental health clinic or center; and (3) jails or prisons. Mental health facilities that have closed since the previous survey are also excluded from the survey.⁴

Content

The 2015 N-MHSS survey instrument was a 8-page document with 23 numbered questions (Appendix A). Topics included:

- Facility type, operation, and primary treatment focus
- Facility treatment characteristics (e.g., service settings; mental health treatment approaches; supportive services/practices; special programs offered; and crisis intervention team availability).
- Facility operating characteristics (e.g., age groups accepted; services provided in non-English languages; and smoking policy)
- Facility management characteristics (e.g., licensure, certification, and accreditation; standard operating procedures; and sources of payment and funding)

Data collection

Three data collection modes were employed: a secure web-based questionnaire, a paper questionnaire sent by mail, and a computer-assisted telephone interview (CATI). Approximately three weeks before the survey launch date (April 30, 2015), SAMHSA mailed letters to the attention of the facility directors of all eligible facilities, alerting them of the survey and requesting their participation in the N-MHSS (Appendix B). The letter also served to update records with new address information received from the U.S. Postal Service. A preliminary mailing with log-in information was sent to facilities, as the web base survey was available in May. Each facility received a data collection packet (including the questionnaire, SAMHSA cover letter, definition package, state-specific letter of support, information on completing the survey on the web, fact sheet of Frequently Asked Questions, and postage-paid business-reply envelope) in July 2015.

Each facility had the option of completing the paper questionnaire and returning it by mail or completing the questionnaire via the secure survey website.

During the data collection phase, contract personnel were available by telephone to answer facilities' questions concerning the survey. Web-based support for facilities completing the questionnaire on the web was also available. Multiple reminder letters were sent to non-respondents over the course of the data collection period via fax, mail, and email. To increase the survey response rate, state mental health agency representatives were contacted during the data collection period to inform

⁴ Facilities are not eligible for inclusion in the survey universe if they provide any of these following services only or in combination: crisis intervention services, psychosocial rehabilitation, cognitive rehabilitation, intake, referral, mental health evaluation, health promotion, psycho-educational services, transportation services, respite services, consumer-run/peer support services, housing services, and legal advocacy. Residential facilities whose primary function is not to provide specialty mental health treatment services are also not eligible for inclusion in the N-MHSS survey universe.

them of their state’s progress and to request additional help in encouraging responses. Blaise®-to-web follow-up of non-respondents began in August 2015 and ended in late January 2016.

Eligibility and unit response rate

Table 1.1 presents a summary of eligibility and response rate information. Of the 17,486 mental health treatment facilities in the survey, 16.7 percent were found to be ineligible for the survey because they did not provide mental health treatment services, had a primary treatment focus of substance abuse services or general health care, provided treatment for incarcerated persons only (i.e., in jails or prisons), or were an individual or small group mental health practice not licensed or certified as a mental health center or clinic.

Ninety-two percent of the 14,573 eligible facilities completed the survey, including 555 facilities that provided administrative services only. Four-fifths of the respondents that were eligible for the report (80.4 percent) completed the survey on the web, 15.4 percent on the telephone, and 4.2 percent through the mail.

Facility Reporting and Selection for the 2015 N-MHSS Report

Of the 14,573 eligible facilities in the survey, 13,388 (91.9 percent) completed the survey. The excluded facilities and reasons for exclusion fell into two categories:

(1) A total of 555 administrative-only facilities were excluded. These facilities are included in SAMHSA’s online Behavioral Health Treatment Services Locator; however, given that these facilities did not provide direct mental health treatment services, they were considered out-of-scope for this report.

(2) A review of the facilities that reported their facility type and operation as “Other” found that 7 facilities were out-of-scope, and were subsequently excluded from the analysis in this report.

After the exclusion of the 562 facilities, data from 12,826 eligible respondent facilities were included in this 2015 N-MHSS report.

Quality Assurance

All mail questionnaires underwent a manual review for consistency and missing data. Calls to facilities clarified questionable responses and obtained missing data. After data entry, automated quality assurance reviews were conducted. The reviews incorporated the rules used in manual editing plus consistency checks not readily identified by manual review. The web-based questionnaire was programmed to be self-editing; that is, respondents were prompted to complete missing responses and to confirm or correct inconsistent responses on critical items. The CATI questionnaire was similarly programmed.

Response Rates

The final unit response rate for eligible facilities was 91.9 percent. Extensive follow-up during data collection and careful editing maximized item response; the item response rates averaged approximately 97.9 percent across all 144 separate items (See Appendix C).

Data Considerations and Limitations

As with any data collection effort, certain procedural considerations and data limitations must be taken into account when interpreting data from the 2015 N-MHSS. Some general issues are listed below. Considerations and limitations of specific data items are discussed where the data are presented.

- The N-MHSS is a voluntary survey and while every effort is made to obtain responses from all known mental health treatment facilities within the scope of the survey, some facilities did not respond. There was no adjustment for the 8.1 percent facility non-response.
- When possible, we used cold-deck imputation to fill in item non-response. This is a technique that uses historical information from previous surveys to supplement the current data. In the N-MHSS, missing values were imputed using survey data collected in 2014.
- Multiple responses were allowed for certain questionnaire items (e.g., services provided in non-English languages and type of payment or insurance accepted for mental health treatment services). Tabulations of data for these items include the total number of facilities reporting each response category.

Organization of the Report

The balance of this report is organized into the following chapters:

- Chapter 2 describes key characteristics of facilities and the programs and services they provided in 2015.
- Chapter 3 presents Census region- and state-level detail for some of the tables presented in Chapter 2.
- Appendix A contains the 2015 N-MHSS mail survey questionnaire.
- Appendix B contains details of the data collection procedures.
- Appendix C contains information on item response rates.

It should be noted that the 2015 N-MHSS findings as discussed in Chapters 2 and 3 of this report, as well as all Chapter 2 and Chapter 3 figures, have been rounded to whole numbers to assist the reader. Please note that percentage distributions in all Chapter 2 and Chapter 3 tables and figures may not add to 100 percent due to rounding. In addition, to protect the confidentiality of data reported at the state-level, the numbers in some Chapter 3 table cells were suppressed.

CHAPTER 2


FACILITY CHARACTERISTICS AND SERVICES

This chapter describes key features of mental health treatment facilities included in the 2015 N-MHSS. See Chapter 1 for definitions of the types of mental health treatment facilities included in the N-MHSS.

Facility Type and Facility Operation

Tables 2.1a-b and Figure 2.1. Facilities were classified according to one of the following facility type categories: psychiatric hospitals, general hospitals, residential treatment centers (RTCs) for children, RTCs for adults, community mental health centers, outpatient mental health facilities, day treatment or partial hospitalization mental health facilities, other type of residential treatment facilities, multi-setting mental health facilities, Veterans Administration (VA) medical centers, or other.

Figure 2.1 below presents the percent distribution of the 12,826 facilities by type of facility.





Tables 2.1a-b and Figure 2.2. Facilities were asked about the type of entity responsible for their operation. Sixty-three percent of all facilities were operated by private non-profit organizations.

Figure 2.2 below presents the percent distribution of the 12,826 facilities by facility operation.

NOTE: Regional/district authority includes local, county, or municipal government.



Service Settings Offered

Table 2.2 and Figure 2.3. The four service settings (levels of care) in which facilities offered mental health treatment services were 24-hour hospital inpatient services (inpatient), 24-hour residential services (residential), less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization services (day treatment/partial hospitalization), and less than 24-hour outpatient services (outpatient). A facility could offer care in more than one service setting.

Figure 2.3 below presents the proportions of the 12,826 facilities by service settings offered.

- Among outpatient mental health facilities, 99 percent offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services, 8 percent offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization services, 1 percent offered 24-hour residential services, and less than 1 percent offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services.
- About 99 percent of psychiatric hospitals offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services. Greater proportions of private psychiatric hospitals than public psychiatric hospitals offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization services (47 vs. 9 percent) and less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services (46 vs. 19 percent).
- Ninety-one percent of multi-setting facilities offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services, 52 percent offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization, 44 percent offered 24-hour residential services, and 14 percent offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services.
- Ninety-eight percent of VA medical centers offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services, while 23 percent offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services.
- Ninety-eight percent of community mental health centers offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services, 16 percent offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization, and 1 percent each offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services or 24-hour residential services.

Treatment Approaches

Tables 2.3a-b. Facilities indicated whether they offered specific types of treatment approaches.

- Among facility respondents, the most commonly offered treatment approaches were individual psychotherapy, cognitive behavioral therapy, group therapy, and psychotropic medication therapy.
- More than 75 percent of each facility type, with the exception of RTCs for adults (53 percent) and other facilities (73 percent), offered cognitive behavioral therapy. Over 75 percent of each different type of facility offered individual psychotherapy and group therapy; the exceptions are RTCs for adults (51 percent offered individual psychotherapy and 55 percent offered group therapy).
- Over 95 percent of psychiatric hospitals, general hospitals, and VA medical centers provided psychotropic medication therapy. By comparison, psychotropic medication therapy was provided less often in other facilities (53 percent), partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities (70 percent), outpatient mental health facilities (69 percent), and RTCs for adults (72 percent).
- The least common mental health treatment approach provided by facilities was electroconvulsive therapy, offered at only 5 percent of all facilities. It was the most commonly offered in general hospitals with a separate psychiatric unit (32 percent), and private psychiatric hospitals (17 percent).

Services and Practices


Tables 2.4a-b. Facilities were asked if they provided specific supportive services and practices. A facility could provide supportive services and practices for more than one type of service or practice.

- Overall, case management (62 percent), family psychoeducation (55 percent), and suicide prevention services (48 percent) were the most common types of supportive services/practices.
- Facilities offering case management ranged from 44 percent of partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities to 80 percent of community mental health centers.
- Facilities offering suicide prevention services ranged from 31 percent of RTCs for adults to 86 percent of VA medical centers.
- Facilities offering family psychoeducation ranged from 25 percent of RTCs for adults to 72 percent of other types of residential treatment facilities.
- Legal advocacy and therapeutic foster care (5 percent each) were the least common types of supportive services/practices offered.
- Public psychiatric hospitals had the largest proportion of facilities that offered legal advocacy (24 percent).
- RTCs for children (14 percent) and multi-setting mental health facilities (13 percent) had the largest proportions of facilities that offered therapeutic foster care.

Age Groups

Table 2.5 and Figure 2.4. Facilities were asked if they accepted the following age groups for treatment: children (aged 12 or younger), adolescents (aged 13 to 17), young adults (aged 18 to 25), adults (aged 26 to 64), and seniors (aged 65 or older). Facilities could accept more than one age group for treatment.

Figure 2.4 below presents proportions of facilities by the age groups accepted for treatment.

- The most common age categories of clients accepted were young adults (85 percent), adults (82 percent), and seniors (79 percent).
- Fewer than half (41 percent) of all facilities accepted persons of all ages for treatment.
- Community mental health centers (69 percent) and outpatient mental health facilities (55 percent) had the largest proportions of all facilities that accepted persons of all ages.


Specially-Designed Treatment Programs or Groups for Specific Client Types

Tables 2.6a-b and Figure 2.5. Facilities were asked if they offered specially-designed programs or groups exclusively for specific client types.

- Among all types of mental health facilities, about half offered exclusively designed treatment programs or groups for persons with serious mental illness (50 percent) and persons with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders (46 percent).

- Almost half of outpatient mental health facilities provided specially-designed treatment programs or groups for persons who have experienced trauma (45 percent) and persons with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders (43 percent).
- A greater proportion of public psychiatric hospitals than general hospitals provided specially-designed treatment programs or groups for forensic clients (51 vs. 9 percent).
- With the exception of RTCs for children, at least 37 percent of all facility types offered special programs or groups for persons with serious mental illness.
- Specially-designed programs or groups for persons with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders were most commonly offered by psychiatric hospitals (60 percent), VA medical centers (59 percent), and multi-setting mental health facilities (53 percent).
- Facility types serving a specific population had the highest proportion of facilities that offered exclusively designed programs for such populations. For example, 81 percent of RTCs for children operated programs designed for children/adolescents with serious emotional disturbance compared with other facility types (ranging from 0 to 58 percent).
- VA medical centers had the highest proportion of facilities that offered programs designed for veterans, persons with post-traumatic stress disorder, and persons with traumatic brain injury (96, 76, and 36 percent, respectively).

Treatment Services Provided in Languages Other than English and for the Hearing-Impaired

Table 2.7. Facilities were asked if treatment services were provided in a language other than English, if staff provided the services in other languages, and in what other languages staff provided services. Facilities were also asked if they offered treatment services for the hearing-impaired.

- Fifty-eight percent of all facilities provided treatment services in languages other than English. In 32 percent of all facilities, staff provided services in Spanish.
- Greater proportions of psychiatric hospitals (72 percent) and community mental health centers (67 percent) provided services in languages other than English than RTCs for children (30 percent) and RTCs for adults (34 percent).
- The proportions of facilities with staff that provided treatment services in Spanish ranged from 16 percent among partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities to 46 percent among public psychiatric hospitals.
- Less than 1 percent of all facilities provided services in an American Indian or Alaska Native language.
- Fifty-seven percent of all facilities offered treatment services for the hearing-impaired. About four-fifths of general hospitals and psychiatric hospitals offered treatment services for the hearing impaired (81 and 78 percent, respectively).

Crisis Intervention Teams

Table 2.8. Facilities were asked whether they employ a crisis intervention team.


- Almost half of facilities indicated that they employ a crisis intervention team to handle acute mental health issues (47 percent).
- Facilities that had a crisis intervention team within the facility and/or offsite ranged from 37 percent of outpatient mental health facilities to 66 percent of community mental health centers.
- A greater proportion of private psychiatric hospitals than public psychiatric hospitals employed a crisis intervention team within the facility and/or offsite (52 vs. 43 percent).

Types of Payment or Insurance Accepted

Tables 2.9a-b. Facilities were asked to indicate whether or not they accepted specified types of payment or insurance for the treatment services they provided.

- Large proportions of community mental health centers accepted Medicaid (97 percent), cash or self-payment (91 percent), and private health insurance (86 percent).
- Greater proportions of RTCs for adults than RTCs for children accepted cash or self-payment (72 vs. 59 percent) and Medicare (54 vs. 13 percent), while greater proportions of RTCs for children than RTCs for adults accepted private health insurance (64 vs. 49 percent) and state-financed health insurance (47 vs. 39 percent).
- A greater proportion of private psychiatric hospitals than public psychiatric hospitals accepted cash or self-payment (94 vs. 85 percent), federal military insurance (73 vs. 49 percent), and state-financed health insurance plan (63 vs. 56 percent).

- At least 79 percent of most facility types, except VA medical centers and other types of residential treatment facilities, accepted Medicaid.
- The majority of all facilities (79 percent) accepted private insurance.

Smoking Policy

Table 2.10. Facilities were asked about their smoking policy.

- Forty-seven percent of mental health facilities reported that smoking was not permitted anywhere outside or within any building, and 43 percent reported that smoking was permitted in designated outdoor areas.
- Compared with all other types of facilities, RTCs for children, public psychiatric hospitals, and general hospitals most commonly prohibited smoking altogether (91, 89, and 88 percent, respectively).
- At least half of RTCs for adults, VA medical centers, multi-setting mental health facilities, and community mental health centers permitted smoking outdoors only (77, 76, 52, and 50 percent, respectively).

Facility Licensing, Certification, or Accreditation

Tables 2.11a-b. Facilities were asked if they have any licensing, certification, or accreditation. A facility could have licensing, certification, or accreditation by one or more agencies or organizations.

- Seventy percent of mental health facilities were licensed, certified, or accredited by state mental health authorities, 43 percent by state departments of health, 43 percent by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), and 33 percent by the Joint Commission.
- Over 80 percent of VA medical centers, psychiatric hospitals, and general hospitals were licensed, certified, or accredited by the Joint Commission.

CHAPTER 3

SELECTED FACILITY CHARACTERISTICS AT THE REGIONAL AND STATE LEVELS

This chapter presents the data for the U.S. Census regions, states, and jurisdictions that were discussed at the national level in Chapter 2. The Chapter 3 tables correspond to most of the tables presented in Chapter 2. Throughout this chapter, states/jurisdictions are defined as the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. territories, including American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Note that facilities operated by federal agencies (i.e., Department of Veterans Affairs, Indian Health Service) are included in the states in which the facilities are located, although these facilities may provide services to clients from other states.

The 12,826 mental health treatment facilities that responded to the 2015 N-MHSS represent a rate of approximately four facilities per 100,000 U.S. population, based on the states and jurisdictions included in this report.⁵ New York and California had the largest total numbers of facilities (985 and 913 facilities, respectively). Three other states had more than 500 facilities each: Florida, Ohio, and Pennsylvania [Tables 3.1a-b]. These five states combined accounted for 28 percent of all mental health treatment facilities that responded to the survey in 2015.

Figure 3.1 defines the U.S. Census Regions for the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Data for all other U.S. territories that were included in the 2015 N-MHSS have been aggregated; throughout this chapter and in the Chapter 3 tables, they are discussed as a single category, “U.S. territories.”

⁵ Based on July 1, 2015, U.S. Census annual estimates, the population for the United States is 321,418,820 and the population for Puerto Rico is 3,474,182 totaling 324,893,002 people (<http://www.census.gov/popest/data/national/totals/2015/index.html>). Based on annual estimation, the World Bank estimated that the population for American Samoa (55,538 people), Guam (169,885 people), and the U.S. Virgin Islands (103,574 people) totaled 328,997 people (<http://data.worldbank.org/indicator/>). When these two sources are combined, the total population for the United States and these jurisdictions is 325,221,999 individuals. This figure was used for subsequent rate calculations in this chapter.



Facility Type

Table 3.1a-b and Figure 3.2. Of the 12,826 mental health facilities, outpatient clinics and community mental health centers accounted for the greatest proportions of facilities (40 and 22 percent, respectively).

- In only one state, fewer than 10 percent of total mental health treatment facilities were outpatient mental health facilities: New Hampshire.
- In two states, 60 percent or more of total mental health treatment facilities were outpatient mental health facilities: Idaho and Wisconsin.
- Five states had 10 or more public psychiatric hospitals: California, Missouri, New York, Texas, and Virginia.
- Four states had more than 30 private psychiatric hospitals: California, Florida, Louisiana, and Texas.
- Four states had more than 50 general hospitals: California, Illinois, New York, and Pennsylvania.
- Four states had more than 35 RTCs for children: California, Massachusetts, North Carolina, and Texas.
- Five states had more than 50 RTCs for adults: Arizona, California, Illinois, New York, and North Carolina.
- Three states had at least 40 partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities: New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania.
- Four states had more than 25 multi-setting mental health treatment facilities: California, New York, Ohio, and Pennsylvania.


Facility Operation

Tables 3.2a-b and Figure 3.3 present data on facility operation.

- Private non-profits operated 63 percent of all mental health treatment facilities. By Census region, the largest proportion of mental health treatment facilities operated by private non-profit organizations was in the Northeast (75 percent), followed by the Midwest (69 percent), West (61 percent), and South (51 percent) [Table 3.2b].
- The proportion of facilities operated by private non-profit organizations was highest in New Hampshire (90 percent), followed by South Dakota and Montana (89 percent each). The proportion of facilities operated by private non-profit organizations was lowest in South Carolina (8 percent), Nevada and Idaho (10 percent each), and Louisiana (24 percent).
- Six states had more than 300 facilities operated by private non-profit organizations: California, Florida, Illinois, New York, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. By contrast, there were five states (Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, North Dakota, and South Carolina) where 20 or fewer of the facilities were operated by private non-profits [Table 3.2a].
- Private for-profits operated 18 percent of all mental health facilities. By Census region, the largest proportion of mental health treatment facilities operated by private for-profit organizations was in the South (25 percent), followed by the West, Midwest, and Northeast (20, 14, and 10 percent, respectively) [Table 3.2b].

- The states/jurisdictions with the highest proportions of facilities operated by private for-profit organizations were Idaho (75 percent), U.S. territories (53 percent), North Carolina (51 percent), Louisiana (42 percent), and Wisconsin (37 percent).
- Seven states had more than 100 facilities operated by private for-profit organizations (Arizona, California, Florida, Idaho, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin), and these seven states combined accounted for 41 percent of all mental health treatment facilities operated by private for-profit organizations [Table 3.2a].
- Overall, regional/district authorities operated 7 percent of all mental health facilities. Regional/district authorities operated 11 percent of facilities in the West, 8 percent of facilities in the South, 7 percent of facilities in the Midwest, and 3 percent of facilities in the Northeast [Table 3.2b].
- Regional/district authorities operated more than 20 percent of facilities in Alabama, California, Utah, and Virginia.
- State mental health authorities (SMHAs) operated 4 percent of all mental health facilities. The proportion was highest in the South (6 percent), followed by the Northeast (5 percent), Midwest (3 percent), and West (2 percent).
- SMHAs operated the highest proportions of facilities in South Carolina (48 percent). SMHAs operated more than 15 percent of facilities in two additional states: Nevada and North Dakota.
- Two states had more than 50 SMHA-operated facilities each: New York and South Carolina [Table 3.2a].

Service Settings Offered

Tables 3.3a-3.6b present the type of service settings offered by type of facility, region, and state/territory. Overall findings by service setting include:

- Of the 2,115 facilities that provided treatment services in 24-hour inpatient settings, general hospitals and psychiatric hospitals combined accounted for 87 percent of the facilities (approximately 53 and 35 percent, respectively) [Table 3.3b].
- By Census region, the proportion of general hospitals that provided treatment services in 24-hour inpatient settings ranged from 41 percent in the West to 60 percent in the Northeast.
- In five states/jurisdictions, less than 40 percent of facilities provided 24-hour inpatient treatment services through a general hospital (Arizona, Georgia, Nevada, Washington, and the U.S. territories).
- Of the 2,354 facilities that provided mental health treatment services in 24-hour residential settings, RTCs for adults, RTCs for children, and multi-setting facilities combined accounted for 81 percent of the facilities (42, 30, and 9 percent, respectively). [Table 3.4b].
- The proportion of RTCs for children that provide treatment services in 24-hour residential settings ranged from 27 percent in the West to 36 percent in the South.
- While the majority of facilities that offered 24-hour residential treatment services were RTCs for children and RTCs for adults, states/jurisdictions varied widely in the distribution of facilities across service settings.
- Of the 2,274 facilities that provided mental health treatment services in less than 24-hour partial hospitalization/day treatment settings, community mental health centers, outpatient mental health facilities, partial hospitalization/day treatment, general hospitals, and multi-setting facilities accounted for 78 percent of the facilities (19, 17, 17, 13, and 12 percent, respectively) [Table 3.5b].
- The proportion of partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities that provide treatment services in less than 24-hour partial hospitalization/day treatment settings ranged from 11 percent in the Midwest to 28 percent in the Northeast.
- The proportion of community mental health centers that provide treatment services in less than 24-hour partial hospitalization/day treatment settings ranged from 13 percent in the Northeast to 25 percent in the South.
- Most of the 9,640 facilities that provided mental health treatment services in less than 24-hour outpatient settings were outpatient mental health facilities (52 percent); less than 1 percent were public psychiatric hospitals [Table 3.6b].
- The proportion of outpatient mental health facilities that provide treatment services in less than 24-hour outpatient treatment settings ranged from 46 percent in the South to 64 percent in the Northeast.
- The proportion of facilities providing less than 24-hour outpatient treatment in outpatient mental health facilities ranged from 13 percent in New Hampshire to 81 percent in Wisconsin.

Treatment Approaches

Tables 3.7a-b present data on treatment approaches offered by mental health treatment facilities by region and state/jurisdiction.

- Individual psychotherapy was offered by 89 percent of all mental health facilities, ranging from 87 percent of facilities in the South to 90 percent each of facilities in the Midwest and in the West [Table 3.7b].
- Sixty-eight percent of all mental health facilities offered couples/family therapy, ranging from 65 percent of facilities in the South to 71 percent in the Midwest.
- Group therapy was offered by 81 percent of all facilities, ranging from 78 percent of facilities in the Midwest to 84 percent in the West.
- Cognitive behavioral therapy was offered by 86 percent of all facilities, ranging from 83 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 87 percent each of facilities in the Midwest and the West.
- At least 65 percent of mental health treatment facilities offered dialectical behavioral therapy in five states/jurisdictions (Colorado, New Hampshire, South Dakota, Utah, and Wyoming).
- Integrated dual disorders treatment was offered by 65 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in four states/jurisdictions (Alaska, Kentucky, Rhode Island, and Wyoming).
- In six states/jurisdictions, 83 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities offered trauma therapy (Colorado, Delaware, Kentucky, South Dakota, Utah, and Wyoming).
- At least 52 percent of the mental health treatment facilities offered activity therapy in six states/jurisdictions (Alaska, Mississippi, Missouri, Oregon, South Dakota, and Vermont).
- In six states/jurisdictions, seven percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities offered electroconvulsive therapy (Delaware, Florida, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Missouri, and North Dakota).
- Telemedicine therapy was offered by 45 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in four states (Alaska, Arkansas, North Dakota, and Texas).
- Psychotropic medication was offered by 90 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in seven states (Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, New York, North Dakota, South Carolina, and Texas).


Services and Practices

Tables 3.8a-b and Figure 3.4 present data on the services and practices approaches offered by mental health treatment facilities.

- Assertive community treatment was offered by 13 percent of all mental health facilities, ranging from 11 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 15 percent in the West [Table 3.8b].
- Twenty-two percent of all mental health facilities offered intensive case management, ranging from 15 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 30 percent in the West.
- Case management was offered by 62 percent of all facilities, from 46 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 76 percent in the West.
- Court-ordered outpatient treatment was offered by 40 percent of all facilities, ranging from 35 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 45 percent in the Midwest.
- At least 29 percent of the mental health treatment facilities offered chronic disease/illness management in four states/jurisdictions (Hawaii, Missouri, Rhode Island, and South Dakota).
- Illness management and recovery were offered by 40 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in five states/jurisdictions (Indiana, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Jersey, and Texas).
- In three states/jurisdictions, more than 35 percent of the mental health treatment facilities offered integrated primary care services (Delaware, Oklahoma, and the U.S. territories).
- Diet and exercise counseling was offered by 40 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in five states (Missouri, New Hampshire, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, and South Dakota).
- Family psychoeducation was offered by 55 percent of all mental health facilities, ranging from 50 percent of facilities in the Midwest to 60 percent in the West.
- Twenty-nine percent of all mental health facilities offered education services, ranging from 27 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 30 percent each of facilities in the Midwest and the West.
- Housing services were offered by 19 percent of all facilities, from 16 percent of facilities in the South to 24 percent in the West.
- Supported housing was offered by 14 percent of all facilities, ranging from 11 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 17 percent in the West.
- At least 55 percent of the mental health treatment facilities offered psychosocial rehab services in five states/jurisdictions (Alaska, California, Idaho, South Carolina, and Utah).
- Vocational rehab services were offered by more than 25 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in seven states/jurisdictions (Arizona, Colorado, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Rhode Island, South Dakota, and Vermont).
- In five states/jurisdictions, 30 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities offered supported employment (Kentucky, New Hampshire, Texas, Vermont, and Wyoming).
- Therapeutic foster care was offered by more than 10 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in four states (Alaska, Missouri, Montana, and South Dakota).
- Legal advocacy was offered by 5 percent of all mental health facilities, ranging from 4 percent each of facilities in the South and Midwest to 6 percent in the Northeast.

- Twenty-seven percent of all mental health facilities offered psychiatric emergency walk-in services, ranging from 22 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 33 percent in the South.
- Suicide prevention services were offered by 48 percent of all facilities, from 43 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 51 percent in the South.
- Consumer-run (peer support) services were offered by more than 30 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in six states/jurisdictions (Arizona, Colorado, Oregon, South Carolina, Texas, and Washington).
- At least 65 percent of the mental health treatment facilities offered screening for tobacco use in four states/jurisdictions (New Hampshire, New York, North Dakota, and Oklahoma).
- Smoking/tobacco cessation counseling was offered by more than 50 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in four states/jurisdictions (Hawaii, New York, Oklahoma, and Utah).
- In six states/jurisdictions, more than 30 percent of the mental health treatment facilities offered nicotine replacement therapy (Louisiana, Missouri, New Hampshire, New York, Oklahoma, and Texas).
- Non-nicotine smoking/tobacco cessation medications were offered by 18 percent of all mental health facilities, ranging from 14 percent of facilities in the West to 23 percent in the Northeast.

Figure 3.4. Mental Health Treatment Facilities Offering Psychiatric Emergency Walk-In Services, by Region: 2015





Age Groups

Tables 3.9 and Figure 3.5 present data on facilities accepting children (aged 12 and younger), adolescents (aged 13 to 17), young adults (aged 18 to 25), adults (aged 26 to 64), and seniors (65 or older) for treatment.

- Regardless of region, higher proportions of facilities accepted young adults or adults than children or adolescents. The proportion of facilities accepting young adults ranged from 82 percent in the South to 89 percent in the Midwest; the proportion accepting adults ranged from 79 percent in the West to 87 percent in the Midwest. The proportion of facilities accepting children ranged from 52 percent in the Northeast to 63 percent in the Midwest and the proportion accepting adolescents ranged from 58 percent in the Northeast to 69 percent in the Midwest.
- Overall, 41 percent of mental health facilities accepted clients of all ages. The proportion of facilities accepting all ages was highest in the Midwest (51 percent). Next were the South (42 percent), West (36 percent), and Northeast (35 percent).
- In four states, more than 60 percent of mental health treatment facilities accepted clients of all ages (Idaho, Iowa, Wisconsin, and Wyoming). In five states/jurisdictions, 27 percent or fewer mental health treatment facilities accepted clients of all ages (California, Delaware, District of Columbia, North Carolina, and Rhode Island).

Figure 3.5. Mental Health Treatment Facilities Accepting Clients of All Ages for Treatment, by Region: 2015





Specially-Designed Treatment Programs or Groups for Specific Client Types

Tables 3.10a-b and Figure 3.6 present facilities offering specially-designed treatment programs or groups for specific client types.

- Overall, the specially-designed treatment programs or groups most commonly offered by mental health treatment facilities were for persons with serious mental illness (50 percent), individuals with co-occurring mental and substance use disorders (46 percent), persons who have experienced trauma (43 percent), and individuals with post-traumatic stress disorder (38 percent).
- In all regions, more mental health treatment facilities offered specially-designed treatment programs for persons with serious mental illness (from 46 percent in the Midwest to 52 percent each in the West) than for children with serious emotional disturbance (from 32 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 38 percent each of facilities in the South and in the West).
- More than 60 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in three states offered specially-designed treatment programs for persons with serious mental illness (Alabama, Rhode Island, and South Carolina). The highest proportions of facilities offering specially-designed treatment programs for children with serious emotional disturbance were in Alaska and North Dakota (64 percent); while 50 percent or more of facilities in six other states (Arkansas, Kansas, Kentucky, Montana, South Dakota, and Wyoming) offered these programs.
- The region with the highest proportion of facilities offering specially-designed treatment programs to individuals with co-occurring mental and substance use disorders was the West (51 percent). Next were the South (48 percent), Northeast (45 percent), and Midwest (40 percent).



Treatment Services Provided in Languages Other Than English and for the Hearing-Impaired

Table 3.11 presents data on facilities providing services in a language other than English and on facilities offering services for the hearing-impaired; Figure 3.7 presents data on facilities offering services for the hearing-impaired.

- The proportion of mental health treatment facilities that provided services in languages other than English ranged from 52 percent in the Midwest to 69 percent in the West. The proportions of facilities where staff provided treatment services in Spanish was 18 percent in the Midwest, 26 percent in the South, 36 percent in the Northeast, and 53 percent in the West.
- California led all states/jurisdictions in the proportion of facilities with staff providing treatment services in Spanish (74 percent). Next were the U.S. territories (70 percent), Arizona (63 percent), New Mexico (62 percent), Florida (58 percent) and Texas (57 percent).
- Overall, more than half of all mental health treatment facilities (57 percent) offered services for the hearing-impaired. The proportion of facilities offering services for the hearing impaired was highest in the South (64 percent). Next were the Midwest (60 percent), West (56 percent), and Northeast (47 percent).
- In five states, 75 percent or more of facilities offered services for the hearing-impaired (Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, Missouri, and North Dakota). Treatment services for the hearing-impaired were offered by 40 percent or fewer of facilities in five states/jurisdictions (Connecticut, District of Columbia, Maryland, New Jersey, and North Carolina).


- Facilities that had a crisis intervention team within the facility and/or offsite ranged from 38 percent in Northeast to 51 percent in South.
- At least 30 percent of facilities indicated that they employ a crisis intervention team to handle acute mental health issues in all except for two states (Iowa and Maine).

Types of Payment or Insurance Accepted

Tables 3.13a-b and Figure 3.8 present data on the specific types of payment or insurance accepted by facilities.

- Overall, Medicaid was accepted by 88 percent of mental health treatment facilities, and it was accepted by 83 percent or more of mental health treatment facilities in all Census regions.
- Medicare payments were accepted by 68 percent of all facilities; the highest proportion was in the Midwest (75 percent). Next were the Northeast (69 percent), the South (67 percent), and the West (62 percent).
- Cash or self-payment was accepted by 83 percent of mental health facilities overall. Ninety-one percent of the facilities in the Midwest accepted cash or self-payment; it was accepted by 84 percent of facilities in the South, 81 percent of facilities in the Northeast, and 76 percent of facilities in the West.
- Seventy-nine percent of all mental health treatment facilities accepted private health insurance. The Midwest had the highest proportion of facilities accepting private health insurance (89 percent). Next were the South (79 percent), the Northeast (77 percent) and the West (69 percent).
- Medicaid was accepted by more than 95 percent of mental health treatment facilities in six states (Arkansas, Maryland, Montana, North Dakota, West Virginia, and Wyoming). It was accepted by 80 percent or fewer of facilities in four states/jurisdictions (California, Florida, Tennessee, and the U.S. territories).
- Medicare was accepted by 80 percent or more of mental health treatment facilities in five states (Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, North Dakota, and South Carolina) [Figure 3.8]. It was accepted by 55 percent or fewer of facilities in two states/jurisdictions (Florida and North Carolina).
- Private health insurance was accepted by more than 95 percent of mental health treatment facilities in five states (Arkansas, Kansas, Minnesota, North Dakota, and Wyoming).

Facility Licensing, Certification, or Accreditation

Tables 3.14a-b. Facilities were asked if they have any licensing, certification, or accreditation. A facility could have licensing, certification, or accreditation by one or more agencies or organizations.

- The percentage of mental health facilities that were licensed, certified, or accredited by state mental health authorities ranged from 65 percent in South to 79 percent in Northeast.
- More than 35 percent of mental health facilities were licensed, certified, or accredited by the state department of health in every Census region.
- At least 35 percent of mental health facilities were licensed, certified, or accredited by the Joint Commission in 3 of the 4 Census regions. In the West, 24 percent of mental health facilities were licensed, certified, or accredited by the Joint Commission.

APPENDIX B

DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURES

Survey Frame

The survey frame for the 2015 N-MHSS originally consisted of 17,486 known facilities. Most facilities in the 2015 N-MHSS frame were identified from the updated database produced after fielding the 2010 and 2015 N-MHSS, the 2014 mental health augmentation, and new facilities that states requested be added to the I-BHS.

Data Collection

Data collection took place between April 30, 2015, and January 19, 2016. During that period, facilities were contacted through mail, email, fax, and telephone to remind them to complete the survey. Of the total 17,486 facilities included in the survey frame, 2,913 (16.7 percent) were closed or ineligible. Ineligible facilities included those that did not provide mental health treatment, were a satellite site,⁶ focused primarily on substance abuse treatment or general health care, provided treatment only for incarcerated persons in jail or prison, or were an individual or small group mental health practice not licensed or certified as a mental health clinic or center. Table 1.1 in Chapter 1 provides a full break-down of closed and ineligible facilities.

⁶ A satellite site is a mental health treatment facility without permanent staff of its own. Staff from another facility visit the satellite site (usually on a regular schedule) to provide treatment.

APPENDIX C

ITEM RESPONSE RATES

To assess the magnitude of item missing data within the facility responses collected in the 2015 N-MHSS, a response rate was calculated for each of the items, $RR_{item\ i}$, as:

$$RR_{item\ i} = \frac{\text{Number of eligible units responding to item } i}{\text{Number of units eligible to respond to item } i}$$

The item response rates in Table C.1 are presented in question order on the 2015 N-MHSS questionnaire. Item non-response was minimized through careful editing and extensive follow-up.

The item response rate for the 2015 N-MHSS averaged 97.9 percent across 144 separate response categories.
