Col 1: 2013 Estimated Civilian Population Aged 9 - 17

Col 2: % of 2013 Related Youth aged 5 to 17 in Poverty (100% of Poverty Level)

Col 3: Which of 3 tiers is a state in terms of the % of Related Youths in Poverty in 2010.

Level of Functioning = or less than 50

Col 4: Lower Limit of Estimate

Col 5: Upper Limit of Estimate

Level of Functioning = or less than 60 (Official Estimate)

Col 6: Lower Limit of Estimate

Col 7: Upper Limit of Estimate
