

## 2013 State Profile — Florida

### National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services (N-SSATS)

The National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services (N-SSATS) is an annual survey of facilities providing substance abuse treatment. It is conducted by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). N-SSATS is designed to collect data on the location, characteristics, services offered, and number of clients in treatment at alcohol and drug abuse treatment facilities (both public and private) throughout the 50 states, the Florida, and other U.S. jurisdictions.

In Florida, 622 substance abuse treatment facilities were included in the 2013 N-SSATS, reporting that there were 53,641 clients in substance abuse treatment on March 29, 2013. The survey response rate in Florida was 88.9%.
